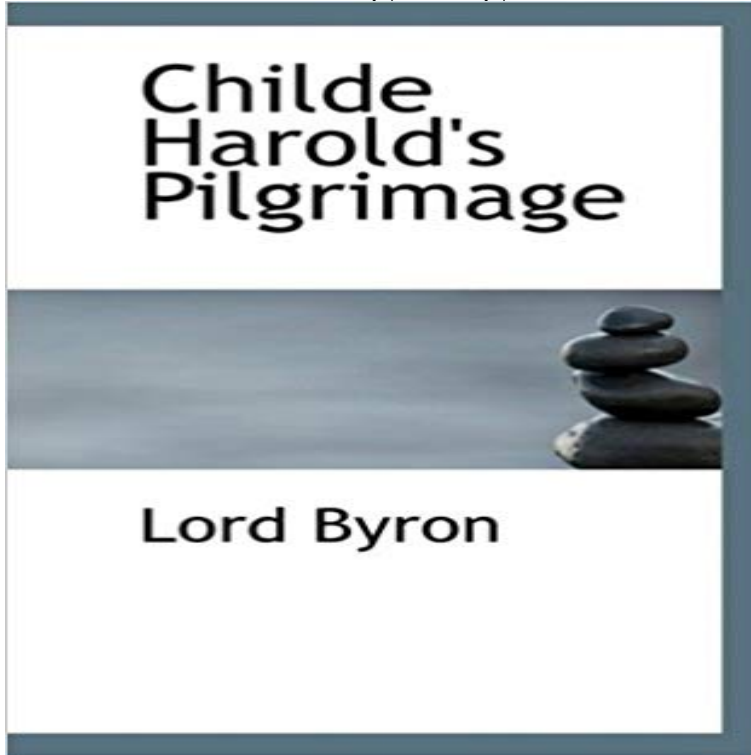


# Childe Harolds Pilgrimage
